Letters to Parents

One invitation letter, and then a registration letter to be completed for each child who attends.

Leader's Booklet

We use this to train leaders, a couple of weeks before holiday club begins.

Bill & Ted Drama's

Ted is all mouth and no brains. Fortunately he has an older brother to guide him through the week, so that they both learn the key ideas. Ted's character is best played by someone with a little acting ability (man or woman) who is willing to be over enthusiastic in public. Bill is the "straight man" and needs some one who can deliver lines, little more!

Bible Study Drama's

These are performed by Bill and Ted and a few friends. The tone of these should be serious. Use some throw over costumes so that Bill and Ted look different, to make the point that these dramas are different.

Worksheets

These are designed for the following age groups...

• Youngest: Reception and possible Year 1

Middle: Years 1 to 4Oldest: Years 5 and 6

Sketches

These are drawn by the super hero "Sketch"- who comes on during the Bill and Ted drama's dressed entirely in black and a mask. He never speaks, only draws.

Buy large sheets of MDF or plasterboard and paint them white, then with pencil draw the outlines of the sketch with pencil. Then when the sketch character comes on he/she need only pen over the lines with a fat pen. If he/she is quick and Bill & Ted talk interestingly, then the children will be wrapped, offering one more way to teach the day's big point.

Handouts

Give out the empty frames to the children at the end of each day, photocopied onto white card. Also give out the "cut outs" photocopied on white paper. These allow the children to go home and make their own copies of the sketches and allow the parents the chance to see what they have been learning. Only days 2-5 have handouts.

 - 3. Tricky one: Can you remember what either of the two signs showed us or even both?

 Darkness shows that God was angry (with sin, and punished Jesus). The torn curtain shows that we can now be friends with God because of Jesus' rescue.

For £500/1 bean: What one thing do we know about this man?

For £1000/ 2 beans: What did the man ask for?

a) Oodles of money b) To give money to Jesus

c) Advice on being a better person d) Life forever with God

For £2000/ 4 beans: How did he think he could get it?

a) By giving Jesus clever answers b) By living God's way

c) By spending money wisely d) By giving cash to the poor

For £4000/8 beans: Did Jesus think this man was good enough for Heaven already?

- a) Yes, because he had obeyed the commandments
- b) Yes, because everyone is quite good, and that's enough
- c) No, because he knew the man was lying about obeying the commandments

What is our aim for Holiday Club?

Our main aim for Holiday Club is to provide an opportunity for children to hear and respond to the good news of Jesus in a fun, exciting and safe environment.

All that we do at Holiday Club builds on and supports our work amongst children at Dundonald throughout the rest of the year. Holiday Club is also the perfect way to begin to build good relationships with the families – so each year we work hard to invite whole families to the service at the end of the week.

Holiday Club is a means to further follow up with our regular children and families and outreach to children and families who would not usually come to church events. It is a unique opportunity in the church year to reach such a large number of families.

Holiday Club also provides us with an opportunity to serve Jesus in different ways, according to our gifts and abilities. It can also be an opportunity to develop skills and abilities in new areas.

We need to remember that however hard we work at making Holiday Club fun and successful, we will achieve nothing unless we pray that God will use our efforts to grow his kingdom and to bring him glory.

The Bible content

This is the most important part of the Holiday Club; therefore almost all of what we do each day is planned to help the children understand the Bible teaching. Each day the story from the Bible will be told and there will be a 5-10 minute talk to help the children grasp the main point of the Bible passage. This will then be followed up by time in small groups, where the aim is to make sure that the children have understood what they have heard and to think through what it means for them as individuals. This focus of the story, talk and discussion is the focus of the day. All our activities aims to focus the children's minds on this time.

All leaders involved with groups have an important role to play in helping the children understand and respond to the Bible teaching. Before Holiday Club starts you can do this by spending some time reading through the Bible passages. You may want to be thinking about the types of questions that you could ask your particular age group to confirm their understanding. Similarly, look through the activity sheets and think how they help the children to apply the teaching – what questions could you ask them as they complete them?

As group leaders at Holiday Club, you will spend most of your time with the children in your group so you can get to know them as individuals. This means that you are best placed to find out how much they understand and where necessary, make appropriate adjustments and reinforcements.



Above all, please be praying that the children in your group will understand and respond to the good news of Jesus.

Going to the Hero Academy

The week is built around Mark's account of Jesus' life. We will find out that Jesus is the ultimate super hero, and unlike every other super hero, he is real and can save us.

The story unfolds for us as seen through the eyes of Bill(/y) and Ted. Bill and Ted are brothers (or possibly brother and sister!) who are spending their week at the Hero academy learning to be super Heroes. As part of their studies, they are also learning about Jesus. As the week goes by they start to realise that Jesus is the only hero worth bothering with. In addition they provide us with a model response to the Gospel. At the beginning of the week they are just excited boys hoping to be heroes, but by the end of the week, they respond by following Jesus. They are such likable characters that they show the children that it is completely normal to decide to follow the true Ruler.

It is also our hope that the children will come to see that Jesus is God's Hero.



We will tell the story using drama's that almost taken straight out of Mark's gospel.

The talks are given by apprentices and staff.

The group leader's primary role is to prepare and lead the discussion with the children as the work sheets (which are given to you) are completed as a group in class rooms.

Quizes, sketches, testimonies and music will all reinforce each day's aim.

Responsibilities

- Refreshers: Orange Squash and biscuits will be provided each day, on trays to each group in their group area. Leaders will love a cup of tea or coffee at refreshment time as well.
- Cleaning: On rotation, helping to clean and set up and also the loos at the end of the day
- Registration: Each morning the children will need to be checked in and have their pass stamped.
- A/V: Someone responsible for the lights, sound and film clips.
- Group Leader: Responsible for a group of children throughout the week. You will need to get to know them and spend time with them. As they may not know each other you will play a key role helping them to relate to one another, encouraging the quieter ones. Please pray for them and remember that they will all be very different and with different relationships with God. Listen to how they speak about God. Our role is to help them to understand the Gospel and not to encourage them to become Christians. Please make the most of the opportunities to talk to the parents at the end of the day when they come to collect their children. One important goal is for the families to return on Sunday.
- <u>Craft or Activity leader:</u> As for the Team Leader, but will also have other responsibilities which mean you may not be with the children all the time. Whenever a team leader is involved with activities at the front, you need to be with your team.

Explaining Christian truth to children

1. Involve the family.

We should seek, as far as possible, to share the good news with the child's wider family. It is important that we do not create conflict between the child and his family, where possible.

Remember when we present big truths like heaven/hell, the child will naturally talk to their parents about this. We want to seek to evangelise the child in a spirit of coming alongside their parents too. So;

- Only share with a child what you would be happy to share with their parents.
- Encourage the child to share with his parents what he/she has done and learnt.
- Do not encourage a feeling of superiority in a being a Christian.
- Make sure the parents get all the relevant information about the family events.
- Try to get to know the parents over the week. It might well feel unnatural at times, but it is worth it for the sake of the gospel. You never know when you might bump into them again! This is also important in follow up. The parents are much more likely to leave their children in our care at future events if they trust us now to be open and honest.

2. Don't assume anything

In a contemporary society, we can no longer presume that a child has any prior Christian teaching of any kind. We start from square one this week.

3. Talk in a way they will understand

The younger the child is, the more they think in concrete, literal terms. As adults we need to do two things:

- Cut out metaphors let Jesus into your heart, may well conjure up images of Jesus forcing himself into their heart! How about take Jesus to be your closest friend? Born again will have the same problem how about make a new start with Jesus as your king?
- Rephrase Christian jargon. Some ideas to start with...
 - Sin: Making yourself King in your life instead of Jesus
 - Christ: God's promised King
 - How might you explain the Holy Spirit or that Jesus is God?

4. Explain the gospel in terms of relationship

All children understand relationships. It is probably the most important and powerful influence in their lives. It makes sense to a child to hear about sin breaking a friendship with God, and Jesus restoring it.

5. Don't just talk at the children, but work alongside them too

We need to be confident in our role as teachers of the gospel, but we also tend to keep talking when we think that it's not getting home. Have confidence to stop. Start work on the activity sheets and come alongside them, listen to their sticking points, help them vocalise what they have learnt. They will remember a lot more this way. Our TV society doesn't encourage much participation on their part. They will value us being interested and listening to them.



Building relationships with children

1. SMILE!

Even on the last day

2. Show that you're interested in them

- Children are not just stupid human beings. They are just smaller human beings. They know when you don't really care. Treat them with the care and respect you would show to adults- would you treat your Bible study group the way you treat children? They know!
- Ask them open questions about themselves- What do you like about Brownies, horses, those books?
- Forge an interest in the magic tricks that they bring to show you.
- Care for them and their needs. Discern moans from real issues

3. Be open with them

Children love to feel that they are getting to know you a bit and what you are like.

4. Be fair

Whatever you feel (we are all drawn to some people more than others) remember the Biblical model of not showing favouritism.

5. No Gossip

If you need to discuss a child, please keep it within your group leadership, or express concerns to the Heroes Academy Leader.



Discipline

We want to provide discipline in order for the children to have a good, safe holiday club. We need to provide positive discipline, and not be scared of it:

- Enjoy the club yourself children will take their attitude lead from you.
- Join in the same principle.
- Get to know the children the children will mostly want to please their leaders.
- Remember their names.
- Include the whole group, including shy or different children the children will see how you respect every member of the group and will imitate you.
- Split up disruption just quietly move or sit between problems.
- Don't shout to get attention devise a signal. Keep your voice firm but low.

Behaviour policy

We rarely have problems in the club, but if someone does behave unacceptably we will follow the procedure below:

- Talk to the child quietly, without humiliation in front of the group, and with regard for the child's age. Explain why the behaviour is unacceptable. Tell The Heroes Academy Leader if this happens 3 times in one morning.
- If this does not help then the child may be temporarily separated from the group, perhaps by joining another group, or by having a cooling off time with another member.
- If this doesn't help, The Heroes Academy Leader will discuss with the parent how best to help the child.
- If the child or another child is in danger, they will be physically removed as quickly as possible and an explanation will be given as soon as it is safe to do so.
- As a last resort, a parent may be asked to remove a child.

The children are the priority at the club. Safety and security are key issues. Please refer all safety issues to The Heroes Academy Leader and report all accidents to him. Leaders T-shirts are to be worn at all times and any strangers need to be challenged.

We will be following the children's act guidelines as outlined below.

Children's Act guidelines

- Welfare of the children is paramount. Treat and respect them as individuals and do not show favouritism. Ensure that any one-to-one conversations are in the sight of other people. Be sensitive to differing cultural and family backgrounds.
- Parental responsibility must be recognised and respected. We are not their parents!
- Smacking or shaking will not be used. Any emergency physical action should be in the form of holding.
- Children must be supervised at all times. If you need to go away from your children make sure that you tell another adult. There should always be a female adult with the group.
