

Cookies Policy

How we use cookies

A cookie is a small file which asks permission to be placed on the hard drive of a computer. Once you agree, the file is added and the cookie helps analyse web traffic or lets you know when you visit a particular site. Cookies allow web applications to respond to you as an individual. The web application can tailor its operations to your needs, likes and dislikes by gathering and remembering information about your preferences.

Overall, cookies help us provide you with a better website, by enabling us to monitor which pages you find useful and which you do not. A cookie in no way gives us access to your computer or any information about you, other than the data you choose to share with us.

You can choose to accept or decline cookies. Most web browsers automatically accept cookies, but you can usually modify your browser setting to decline cookies if you prefer. This may prevent you from taking full advantage of the website. There are two types of cookie you may encounter when using this website:

First party cookies

These are our own cookies, controlled by us and used to provide information about usage of our site.

ci_session	Authentication session to preserve any sign ins and other changes you might have made during your visit to this site.	Hashed data referring to your unique visit. No personal information unless signed in.	On exit

cookie_notice	Used to suppress the cookie notice once the user opts to hide it	“Yes” or “No”	31 days, updated with each visit
prefixed with X-Mapping-	Set by our web server to manage content delivery on cloud based servers	Information about which server is providing content to the user	On exit

Third party cookies

These are cookies found in other companies' internet tools which we are using to enhance our site, for example Facebook or Twitter have their own cookies, which are controlled by them.

Google Analytics	These cookies are used to collect information about how visitors use our site. We use the information to compile reports and to help us improve the site. The cookies collect information in an anonymous form, including the number of visitors to the site, where visitors have come to the site from and the pages they visited.	Google Privacy policy
