In today's video, we saw Mary and Joseph travelling a long way from Nazareth to Bethlehem to be counted. While they were there a very special thing happened.

- Have you ever been away from home when something special happened? What was that special thing?

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. And everyone went to their own town to register. Luke 2:1, 3

- Who told everyone that they needed to be counted?
- Where did they have to go to register?

Caesar Augustus was the ruler of the whole Roman world. He wanted to count his people, so he made everyone travel to their family's home town. Caesar thought he was in charge. The Bible tells us that God is the "Most High", he is really the one in charge.

- When do you see people acting like they are in charge, not God? Do you ever act like you are in charge?

So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. Luke 2:4-5

- Who was Joseph going to marry?
- Which town did they have to travel to?

Mary and Joseph had to go on a long journey to Bethlehem, where a king called David lived a long time ago. Joseph was part of King David's family.

 King David was famous, so Joseph would have heard stories about his life. Do you know any stories about your grandparents or great-grandparents?



While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and Mary gave birth to her firstborn, a son. Luke 2:6-7

- Did Mary have a son or a daughter?
- What was the name of the town where Jesus was born? Hundreds of years before Jesus was born, God had promised that his king would be born in Bethlehem. God had kept his promise. God keeps all of his promises.
- Why do you think God wants us to know that he keeps his promises?

She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them. Luke 2:7b

- What was Jesus wrapped in?

A manger is a place where food is put for animals to eat. What a strange place to use as a bed for a baby!

- Why was Jesus put in a manger and not a cot?
- God sent his king to a poor and simple place, what does this show us about Jesus?

In today's video we met some shepherds who were out on the hillside looking after their flock of sheep. Suddenly the sky was filled with a bright light and they saw more angels than they could count, who told them some amazing news.

What is the best news that you have ever been told?Why was it so good?

And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. Luke 2:8-9

- Who appeared to the shepherds?
- How did the shepherds feel when they saw the angel? Shepherds were often smelly as they lived with their sheep. Most people didn't want to be friends with them and they weren't very important. But that night, an angel appeared to them.
- Who would you expect an important angel to appear to?
 Why do you think God sent an angel to some shepherds?





But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord." Luke 2:10-11

The angels had an amazing message for the shepherds. The Messiah, God's king who would save his people, had been born just as God had promised!

- Who is the good news for?
- Where would the shepherds find this baby who is their Messiah and Saviour?
- How would you feel if you were given this news? Why would you feel like that?

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about." So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. Luke 2:15-16

- What did the shepherds decide to do?
- How quickly did the shepherds go to Bethlehem?

The shepherds found that everything the angels had said was true. God's word is totally trustworthy, then and today.

- Are there times when you find it hard to trust that God's word is true?



When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. Luke 2:17-18

- What did the shepherds do on their way back to the fields?
- How did people react to the message they heard from the shepherds?

There are lots of different reactions to the Christmas story. Some people are amazed. Some people want to find out more. Some people don't believe it is true. Some people think it is only for other people.

- How do you feel about this good news of Jesus?


